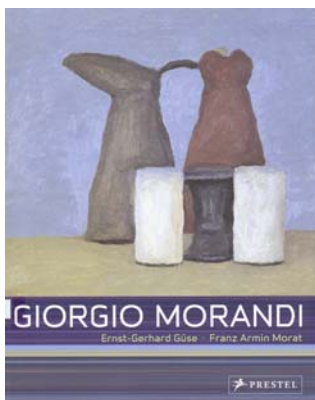
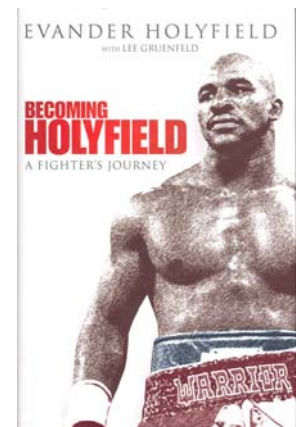


Dreams From My Father by *Barack Obama*

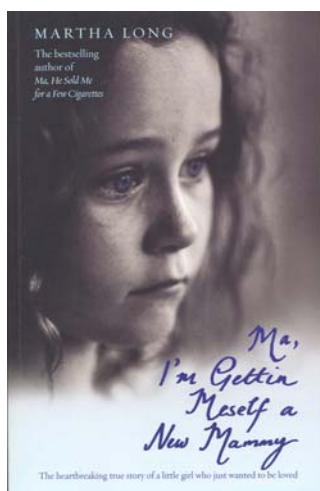


Giorgio Morandi: by Ernst-Gerhard Guse and Franz Armin Morat

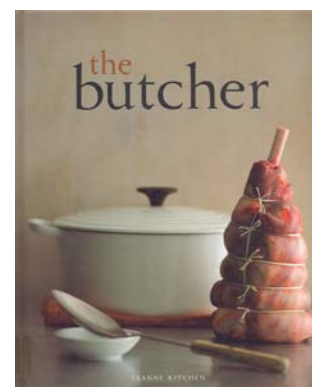


Ma, I'm Getting Meself a New Mammy by Martha Long

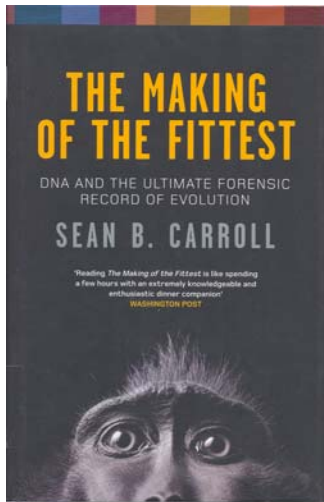
Good meat is a revelation. This title focuses on identifying, locating, buying, preparing and cooking produce of the highest quality and most satisfying flavour.
