### **4. COMMUNITY & ENTERPRISE & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT & CORPORATE SERVICES**

- (a) Visual & The GB Shaw Theatre- Progress Report**

The Chairman welcomed Ms. Carissa Farrell, Director of Visual & The George Bernard Shaw Theatre to the meeting. In attendance were Ms. Róisín McGarr, Theatre Manager and members of the operational team, Joe Watters, Pat Delaney, Ronan Fitzgerald and Sinead Dowling. Ann Scully, Arts Office was also in attendance.

Ms. Farrell’s presentation covered the following areas:-

- The structure of the Carlow Arts Centre

- Staffing Structure, full-time salaried, part-time salaried, casual employees, FAS, freelance technical staff and volunteers.
- Opening Celebrations September 2009 and Media coverage of Opening.
- Visual Arts Genres and Events – Local, National and International.
- The GB Shaw Theatre Programme to date – 170 events- Local, National and International.
- Performing Arts audiences to date – An average attendance of 77% for performing arts events (against national average of 58%). 47% of the audience comes from Carlow Town and 23% from County Carlow. 85% adults.
- Partners – Local, National and International
- Awards
- Strategic objectives going forward – building relationships.

Members thanked Ms. Farrell for her excellent presentation and paid tribute to her and her team for their work and dedication. Members paid tribute to Mr. Joe Watters, Town Clerk for his work on the project since its inception and wished him well on his forthcoming retirement. Mr. Watters thanked the Members for their good wishes and hoped that with the support of everyone this flagship project will be successful.

The County Manager congratulated everyone involved with this unique model, flagship project for Carlow and stressed the importance of maintaining its success.

Ms. Farrell thanked the Members for their support and answered queries raised by Members.

## **(b) Community & Enterprise Progress Report**

Members had progress report for the period January – June 2010 from Ms. B. O'Brien, Director of Services.

The report covered the following.

- Arts

Visual and George Bernard Shaw Theatre

County Arts Programme initiated and completed since January 2010.

- Economic Development/Business Support Unit

The initiatives Carlow Local Authorities were involved with included Speed Networking Event, Carlow Fashion week, European SME Week, Business Club Lunch Networking Event, New Start Carlow 2010 and Navigating Your Business Through Uncertain Times.

The report set out the current activities of Carlow Community Enterprise Centres Ltd., Bagenalstown Community Enterprise Centre, Express for Success and Fresh Start Enterprise Development Programme.

The report advised of two new capital projects – Carlow Main Drainage and Flood Relief Scheme and Carlow County Museum.

- Carlow County Development Board

The County Development Board continues to deliver actions prioritised in the CDB Action Plan 2009-2012.

Such actions include submission to South–East Regional Authority re Draft Regional Planning Guidelines for the South East Region 2010-2012 and discussions with relevant bodies re maximising resources and providing the best and most convenient standard of service to the public in the Graiguecullen area.

The report set out the workings and initiatives of the following groups under the Carlow County Development Board – CDB Executive Board, CDB Economic Forum, Carlow County Development Partnership Ltd., Traveller Interagency Strategy Group, Carlow Comhairle Na nÓg, Carlow County Childcare Committee, Social Inclusion Measure (SIM) Working Group, Carlow Children and Young Person's Services Committee, Carlow Volunteer Centre and Carlow Community & Voluntary Forum.

- Community Initiatives

Community Environmental Grants, County Carlow's Litter League, Carlow's Pride of Place, Co-operation Ireland Pride of Place, Tidy Towns, and National Tree Week.

- County Carlow Sports Partnership

The report covered the 2010 Calendar of Training Programmes. Members expressed satisfaction with the recruitment of a Sports Inclusion Disability Officer with County Carlow Sports Partnership for a 12 month fixed term contract.

- Carlow RAPID (Tullow Road, Carlow and Graiguecullen)

The report outlined initiatives undertaken under the RAPID programme- Employment & Training Initiative, grant aid under the Dormant Accounts Fund-additionality, Open Door CDP, maintaining green spaces supported by Community Services Programme in Probation & Welfare, Christmas Celebrations at Croppy Place, Graiguecullen Needs Analysis, John Sweeney Park Community House, Carlow Men's Health Group and Carlow Access Movement. The Carlow RAPID Area Implementation Team has made a submission to increase the area by five estates.

- Other Areas of Responsibility

Carlow Town & County Amenity Trust and CRISP.

Members expressed their thanks to the staff of Carlow Town and Amenity Trust for their work.

Ms. O'Brien to pass on the good wishes to FÁS.

Ms. O'Brien advised Members of the provision of extra train services p by Iarnród Eireann on the Carlow route.

Members raised the following issues:-

- Business - Carlow Town Centre
- Courthouse, Tullow
- Tullow Town Park

Ms. O'Brien advised that Tullow Courthouse is in need of financial investment and is not suitable for public use under Health and Safety Regulations.

Ms. O'Brien advised that phase 1 of Tullow Town Park is now complete and negotiations are in progress for funding to complete landscaping and purchase playground equipment. Members will be circulated with a report on the Town Park at the next Electoral Area Meeting.

**(c) Co-operation Ireland Pride of Place 2010**

Ms. O'Brien advised Members that the 2010 entry in the Co-Operation Ireland Pride of Place competition under the theme "Community Arts Initiatives" is the Carlow Storytellers Group. Judging day is Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> June.

Members paid tribute to the staff for their excellent work with Carlow's Pride Of Place.

**(d) Extension of Control of Consumption and Possession of Intoxicating Liquor in Public Places Bye Laws**

Ms. B. O'Brien, Director of Services informed Members that at a Joint Policing Committee meeting held on the 17<sup>th</sup> May, 2010 it was agreed to recommend to Council for their consideration that similar Bye Laws (adopted 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2007 for Tullow) be adopted to extend same to other large centres of population in County Carlow.

Members to consider centres of population to which the Bye Laws are to be extended. This item is to be brought to the July meeting of Council for further consideration.

**(e) Tenders for opening, if any**

Members noted tenders opened since the last Council meeting.

Members raised the following issues:-

- The safeguarding of subcontractors where the main contractor fails to honour agreement. The need for secure bond system.
- Supervision by Council of contractors for quality of work and Health and Safety.
- Time scale for completion of contracts.
- Notification of Tendering process and format on web site.

The County Manager advised that the tendering process is a national standard form of tender and any issues with the process would have to be addressed nationally. He further advised that the awarding of a contract is an executive function and that due to commercial sensitivity names with tender prices cannot be published in the public domain. Responsibility rests with the Main Contractors with regard to sub contractors and not the Council.

**Presentation by Minister Mary White, T.D**

The Cathaoirleach on behalf of the Members welcomed Deputy Mary White T.D., Minister for Equality, Integration and Human Rights to the Chamber.

The Minister gave a very informative presentation on her portfolio to the Members. Her main aims and responsibilities include the following areas:-

- The promotion of the integration of persons who are not Irish citizens and who are lawfully resident in the State. 9% of the population of Carlow is legal immigrants.
- The promotion of equal opportunities – economic and social.
- The development and implementation of policies to combat discrimination and to promote a more inclusive society.
- Promotion and support of equal participation in society of people with disabilities.
- Gender Equality Issues.
- Policy development in relation to travellers in Irish society.

Members thanked Minister White for her presentation and wished her well in her new role.

Queries raised by Members were answered by the Minister.

## **5 PLANNING, RECREATION & AMENITY & SPECIAL PROJECTS**

### **(a) Proposed Development Contribution Scheme 2010/Multi Annual Capital Works Programme 2010/2014.**

Members had report from the Director of Services on the Draft Development Contribution Scheme 2010.

Mr. O'Connor advised that the Multi-Capital Works Programmes is currently under review as the existing works programme expires in the current year (2006-2010). It is now proposed that Development Contribution Scheme be reviewed in relation to reduction of charges in respect of commercial and industrial development.

The proposed 2010 Scheme includes the following features:

- Reduce the contributions by 10% required for Industrial development from €27.70 to €25.60 per m<sup>2</sup>.
- Reduce the contributions required for Commercial development from €42.71 to €38.50 per m<sup>2</sup>.
- An increase of 5-10% for houses serviced by public sewerage.

- Reductions for provision of agri-business, horticulture buildings, golf courses, telecommunications masts and recreational facilities.

Members expressed concern at the drop in business in Tullow Street and discussed rate rebate/reduction, incentive schemes to encourage business and the utilisation of existing vacant buildings in the town centre. The rateable valuation of property on Tullow Street was also raised. Mr. P. Delaney, Head of Finance advised that the valuation of property is set by the Commissioner of Valuation and rates are levied on this figure multiplied by the annual rate adopted each year by the Members. Members felt annual turnover and size of business should be considered when levying rates.

Following discussion it was agreed that Members would require further consideration with the SPC and full Council before finalising Proposed Development Charges Scheme and Multi-Annual Capital Works Programme 2010-2014.

Members noted response from Mr. S. O’Connor, Director of Services in relation to this motion.

## **6. HOUSING, TRANSPORTATION & EMERGENCY SERVICES**

### **(a) Housing Progress Report**

Members welcomed progress report for the period January to May 2010 from Mr. D. McInerney, Director of Services. The report highlighted activities in the following areas.

- Housing Construction Programme

Members noted table outlining 2010 allocations for Carlow County Council and Carlow Town Council with comparison to 2009. There has been a reduction of €3,290,000.

The National Housing Policy is moving away from construction and purchase to leasing of vacant newly constructed properties.

- Voluntary Housing

Members noted recent circular aimed at meeting the accommodation needs of older people, persons with a physical, mental health, intellectual or sensory disability, elderly returning emigrants and persons exiting temporary homeless accommodation etc. A fund of €25m is being set aside in 2010 to support the acquisition of properties.

- Housing Needs Assessment

There are 753 on Carlow County Council housing list and 1,203 on the Carlow Town Council list.

- Housing Maintenance/Allocations

Planned maintenance is continuing. The cost of exceptional work due to severe weather was €46,000. An application for additional funding has so far being unsuccessful.

To date there were 19 houses allocated - all casual vacancies.

- Improvement Works in Lieu and Extensions

Members noted the status of Improvement Works in Lieu and Extensions at 31<sup>st</sup> May 2010.

- Affordable Housing

Negotiations are at an advanced stage on the lease of unsold affordable dwellings for a period of 5 years with Clúid Housing Association. Tenants will have the opportunity to purchase under the Incremental Purchase Scheme.

- Housing Grants

The allocation for the disability and older people grant schemes for 2010 amounted to €1,868,000. It is now proposed to proceed with Priority 3 disability grants and a decision will be made before the 31<sup>st</sup> July regarding the re-opening of the Housing Aid for Older People Grants.

- Housing Loans and Tenant Purchase  
Members noted the loan activity for 2009.

- RAS (Rental Accommodation Scheme)  
Ras has successfully accommodated 248 private households in Carlow over the last four years. In addition 67 voluntary households have been transferred to RAS.

- Homelessness  
Members noted the South East Homeless Action Plan which was adopted at the May meeting of Council and the appointment of The Tenancy Sustainment Officer.

- Radon  
Carlow Local Authorities have tendered for a programme of measurement of Radon levels in its housing stock with agencies approved by the Radiological Protection Institute of Ireland.

- Strategic Policy Committee  
The report outlined the principle items discussed by the SPC at their 2010 meetings.

- Traveller Accommodation  
A meeting of the Local Traveller Accommodation Consultative Committee was held in 2010 and matters discussed included accommodation update, horses in housing estates and Men's Development Network.

- Anti-social Behaviour Strategy  
The Draft Anti-social Behaviour Strategy in accordance with Circular SHIP 2009/07 is being referred to statutory bodies for their consideration and observation. The final date for adoption by Council is 11<sup>th</sup> October 2010.

- Land Aggregation Scheme  
A new Land Aggregation Scheme has been developed for land owned by a Local Authority in respect of which outstanding loans with the Housing Finance Agency have fallen due for payment. Housing

Authorities may apply to the Department to pay off capital and loan costs attaching to a particular site. The Department will recoup the outstanding capital and interest and the ownership of the land will transfer to a central body.

Queries raised by Members were answered in detail by Mr. McInerney.

## **7. ENVIRONMENT, WATER SERVICES & HEALTH & SAFETY**

### **(a) To note position regarding the Adoption of the South East River Basin District Management Plan**

Members expressed disappointment that the amendment relating to Nitrates Regulations put forward at the April Meeting of Council for the removal of paragraph 4, section 5.2.3 page 59 had been rejected .  
The County Manager advised that the legal advise from the Attorney General indicated that the Plan could not be amended or altered. The Plan was adopted by the County Manager as the statutory time period for its adoption by members had elapsed.

## **8. CORRESPONDENCE**

### **Members noted resolution from Shannon Town Council**

*“In light of the increasing mortgage payment crisis, Shannon Town Council call on the Government to introduce a 24 month moratorium from the time mortgages first go into arrears before repossession proceedings can be taken.”*

### **Members noted resolution from Wexford County Council**

*“Wexford County Council call on the Minister for Transport in response to “The Marine Pollution Prevention, Preparedness and Response Capabilities Study 2008” to immediately provide Emergency Towing Vessels(ETV) around the Irish coastline in order to protect Ireland’s coastline from Economic and Environmental damage .”*

**Members noted correspondence from Dublin City Council** in relation to Members’ motions to reverse the Carbon Tax announced in last December’s budget and calling for the Home Energy Saving Grant and Warmer Homes Scheme Grant handled by Sustainable Energy Ireland to come under the control of each relevant local authority.

### **Members noted resolution from Castleblaney Town Council**

*“That this Council demand that An Taoiseach, Brian Cowan, T.D., Brian Lenihan, T.D., Minister for Finance and the Government provide a financial aid package or relief’s for residential mortgage holders and S.M.E.’s(small and medium enterprises) who find themselves through no fault of their own, having great difficulty meeting their financial commitments at this time.”*

### **Members noted motion from Monaghan Town Council**

Calling on Brian Lenihan, T.D., Minister for Finance to explore the possibility of re-examining the basis on which rates are levied by Local Authorities on commercial properties throughout the country.

**Members noted resolutions from Macroom Town Council**

*“ In light of the economic plight we now find ourselves in and the collapse of the building industry, Macroom Town Council call on all local authorities to review their Development Charges. We are no longer in the Celtic Tiger era and we need to make drastic changes to kick start our economy again. In all areas of business, costs are falling and local authorities need to drastically reduce Development Charges to adapt to changing times.*

*“Macroom Town Council call on the Minister for the Environment, Heritage and Local Government to review section 254 of the Planning Act, 2000 in relation to the fees levied in respect of advertising structures particularly fingerpost signs. The current fees of €630 per year for a fingerpost sign should be substantially reduced to €200 for commercial users. In the case of clubs and voluntary organisations a standard charge of €50 per year should apply.*

**Members noted correspondence from North Tipperary County Council**

regarding correspondence sent to the Minister for Health and Children relating to funding for the work done by support groups such as the Parkinson’s Association of Ireland.

Members noted correspondence sent to the Financial Regulator expressing concern at the interest rates being charged by money lenders to those who are in financial hardship arising from the recession. Concern was also expressed at the pressure being brought to bear by Banks and Credit Card Companies on people who are in severe financial difficulties.

**Members noted resolution from Limerick Town Council**

*“That, Limerick County Council calls on the Minister for Finance to amend the legislation requiring Rating Authorities to demand rates from owners or subsequent occupiers of commercial properties, for a vacant period following the departure of a previous tenant, after the date of making the rate for the year.”*
