### **7.1 Standing in the name of Cllr. Fintan Phelan**

'That Carlow County Council supports the right to Personal Assistance Service (PAS) for disabled people to have freedom, choice and control over all aspects of their lives to enable them to fully participate in an inclusive society as equals. That this local authority would call on the Government and the Minister with responsibility for Disabilities to enact legislation to standardise and fund additional PA hours.'

### **7.2 Standing in the names of Cllrs Andy Gladney, William Paton and William Quinn**

"Noting the vital social and economic role played by Post Offices play in communities throughout County Carlow, that we the members of Carlow County Council call upon the Minister for Climate Change, Communications Networks and Transport, Mr. Eamon Ryan, TD; the Minister for Fiance, Mr. Paschal Donoghue, TD and the Minister for Public Expenditure and Reform, Mr. Michael McGrath, TD to urgently enact the private members' motion previously passed in November 2016 by the previous Government regarding the future of the Post Office Network. This is a matter of urgency to ensure the sustainability of our existing community Post Office Network."

### **7.3 Standing in the name of Cllr. Brian O'Donoghue**

"That the members of Carlow County Council support all students who put their lives on the line during the ongoing Covid pandemic. In this regard the members of Carlow County Council request the Government to bring forward legislation that ensures that any student, be they trainee health worker, Gardaí, defence force personnel, or any essential public service, called to the frontline during any national crises, be paid a fair wage, on a level equal to colleagues doing the same role. Furthermore, that student nurses, in particular, who were/are on placement in 2020 be paid, back dated where necessary, for their time spent working on the frontline"

### **7.4 Standing in the name of Cllr. Thomas Kinsella**

"Calling on Carlow County Council to make arrangements with Dog Wardens to visit Mount Leinster(nine stones area)at week ends especially Sunday afternoons to ensure that Bye Laws regarding control of Dogs are fully enforced."

### **7.5 Standing in the name of Cllr. John Cassin**

"That Carlow County Council write to the Minister for Health and inform him of its disappointment at the Government decision not to pay student nurses. Like all frontline workers at the face of the global pandemic, student nurses sacrificed their movement between hospital or any other residential homes for fears of cross contamination and this excluded them from getting work as support staff. Compared to apprentices who are paid from the day they start it is not until the fourth year of

training that year nurses start to get paid. We as a Council respectfully ask the Minister and the government to reverse the decision."
