Notice of Proposed Development - Part 8**

**Applicant: Carlow County Council. Location: Borris Viaduct, Borris, County Carlow**

Proposal: In accordance with the above regulations Carlow County Council proposes to carry out the following development located at the Borris Viaduct, Borris County Carlow.

The project involves the redevelopment and upgrading of the viaduct to include the following:

- **Provision of Landscaped access at the North Western end of Viaduct with both universal access paths and stepped access paths**
- **Provision of guarding to the viaduct**
- **Provision of parking**
- **Conservation of the structure**
- **Provision of Bicycle Racks**
- **Provision of Information Signage**
- **Provision of Public Lighting at Car Parking area**

The plans and particulars of the proposed development will be available for inspection or purchase at a fee not exceeding the reasonable cost of making a copy for a period of 4 weeks during office hours at the offices of the Local Authority, from 9.15am to 5.00pm as follows:

In accordance with Article 81 of the Planning & Development Regulations 2001-2018, Carlow County Council has concluded from a preliminary examination, that there is no real likelihood of significant effects on the environment arising from the proposed development and that an Environmental Impact Assessment is not required. Any person may, within 4 weeks from the date of this notice, apply to An Bord Pleanála for a screening determination as to whether the proposed development would be likely to have significant effects on the environment.
