2. Consideration of Reports and Recommendations

2.1 Housing Progress Report

Members were circulated with details of Housing Progress report for the Municipal District of Tullow and briefed on same.

Queries raised were responded to by the Senior Executive Officer and Director of Services.

It was noted that Rural Cottage at Drumphaea is in the Municipal District of Bagenalstown and this to be amended in future reports.

2.2 Proposed extension to Tullow Cemetery

Members were circulated with report on the proposed extension to Tullow Cemetery and options explored were advised by the Director of Services.

The recommended option is to extend the current site as detailed on the map circulated which can accommodate up to 1,000 new spaces which was agreed. The existing graveyard is zoned under "Community Services and Education" in the Tullow Local Area Plan 2017-2023. The proposed extension land is currently zoned "Existing Residential/Infill", and therefore will require a change to the existing zoning. It was agreed that this should be considered as part of the next review of the Local Area Plan.

2.3 Infrastructure Report

Members were circulated with Infrastructure Report from Area Engineer and were briefed on the position in relation to projects in the Area taking into consideration COVID 19 requirements.

All Area Staff were complimented on the progress to date.

3. Any Other Business

The following items were raised:-

- (1) Land at Slate Row, Hacketstown – are there any proposals to build housing
- (2) Land in the ownership of the Housing Agency in Hacketstown - concerns were raised regarding the security of this land.
